

Results, August 1992 North American QSO Parties

The August 1992 North American QSO Parties were another success. Though conditions and participation suffer in comparison to the January event, activity and scores were up for August.

The CW weekend featured a lot of familiar faces in the NAQP. Bill, KM9P, finished first for a second consecutive win. Keeping him honest was the King of Low Power Sweepstakes, Ralph, N5RZ, who recently relocated to West Texas. Unfortunately for Ralph and others out west, 10 meters didn't prove to be a big advantage. The deciding band turned out to be 40 meters, where KM9P worked 35 more QSOs than N5RZ.

Ron, AA5DX, came home from his ocean duty to place third with a fine effort. Ron's 80-meter number was the best in the contest, which is not easy from Texas in August. Bill, N4AR, cruised his way into fourth place from Kentucky. One other score worth mentioning in the top ten is that of Tim, KJ4VH. Tim has been active in all of the NAQPs since the format changed two years ago. Not only has he put together a top-rate group of guys for his teams, but he has also worked his way into the top ten for the first time!

The phone weekend was not much different from CW in terms of propagation. QSOs on 10 meters and 160 meters took a lot of work in the form of passing people from band to band. Most of the QSOs on 10 seemed to follow a north/south pattern, which allowed a few of the boys in the Midwest to sneak into the top ten.

K0KR's huge 20-meter QSO total ultimately did in the competition. Bob worked more people on 20 meters alone than a third of the top ten worked in the entire contest! More impressive yet is that this was Bob's first NAQP. In second place, Bob, KW8N, did a good impression of Joe Montana by passing mults like a pro. Bob worked 39 more multipliers than *anyone else* in the contest to almost make up the 250-QSO deficit to K0KR. Other greatly improved scores came from Tom (N6NF), Ken (NV1P), Scott (KA9FOX), Brian (N7LOX), and Frederick (AA4RX). All of these guys have been regulars to the NAQPs. Their practice has obviously paid off, judging by their fine scores.

The team competition in the NAQP consists of five-member teams with no geographic restrictions or limitations. This past August, however, was dominated by a group from Kentucky. The Kentucky Contest Group put together a first-rate group for both modes to walk

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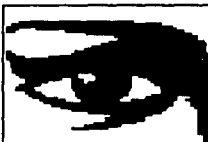

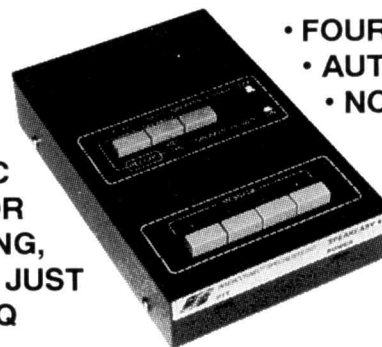
