Through the graciousness of ICOM America, a W0ETC memorial plaque will be presented to each member of the winning team in this and future NAQP RTTY contests. Larry became a Silent Key on October 25, 2005. He may be gone, but he will never be forgotten! RIP.

When the engraver asks, "Aren't you forgetting AA5AU?" it's bound to be a "different" NAQP RTTY! Charlie, KI5XP, took full advantage of AA5AU being otherwise occupied with Hurricane Katrina cleanup and easily outdistanced the field with his outstanding score of 141,589. Those of you who attended Charlie's presentation of W5WMMU at Dayton have little to wonder about his success. George, K5PI, operated W6KFT to a second place finish with a score of 97,500. Dave, K6LL, is third with a score of 95,418. Dave (aka "Red"), W7WW, is fourth with a score of 87,731. Mark, K5AM, finished fifth with a score of 86,523.

W6YX (K6UFO, N6DE, N7MH, W6LD, W6RK) continued their domination of M/2 with a score of 157,688. WW4LL (K4AQ, K4ZJ, WF4W, WW4LL) came in second with a score of 96,404.

Team competition again was dominated by SWACC (KI5XP, K6LL, W7WW,

K5AM and K7WM) with a score of 485,321. Each member of SWACC will receive the W0ETC memorial plaque so graciously sponsored by ICOM America! SO1R (WX4TM, W1ZT, K9MUG, W6WRT and K4WW) was second, and NCCC #1 (W0YK, NT6K, K6RIM, N6RCE and K6DGW) was third. There were many SO logs submitted with no team affiliation. I urge you to either organize a team or make yourselves available to be on a team. The competition between team members contributes to the fun, and

maybe someday SWACC will "slip up" and allow someone else to win the team competition.

Mohamed, CN8KD, led the DX contingent with a score of 4,944, closely followed by Gary, CU2JT, with a score of 4,128.

There were 259 NA logs and 10 DX logs submitted.
