

January 1997 NAQP SSB Results

This was another big turnout for the January NAQP SSB. Lots of good participation, 24 team entries, and increased multi-operator competition made for a high-energy contest. The top single-operator award was heavily contested between perennial winner K6LL and K4AB from Team Alabama. When the smoke cleared, K4AB won with higher QSOs and mults on 80 and 160. But the difference was less than 5,000 points.

In the multi-operator class, usual first place holder K5TR <ex-WB5VZL> had some stiff competition from the SMC gang operating at KS9K. There were also two other high scoring multi-op entries, including one from the "under-construction" station of Joe Rudi, NK7U.

In the team category, the Southern California Contest Club did it again, followed by the Florida Contest Group, the Texas DX Society and Team Alabama. A word from the log checkers: if you are sending diskettes through the mail, please remember to send 3.5" diskettes only, and PLEASE send them in a mailer. Unprotected diskettes rarely survive the trip and are unreadable by the time we receive them. Remember to name your files with [your call.ext], and please don't send binary files. Check the rules if you have questions about log submission or ask K6ZZ or K6AW.

Also, please notice the soapbox comments from N6TR regarding the 160m band plan.

I could just see the smile on her face...way to go Linda! I love this contest!! The exchanges can be good for a few laughs along the way too...Joe MT, Cajun LA. DOC from KC7HAX (It made me think of the Chicago Hope where Cronk hacked off a leg with a chain saw...obscure but funny)...KK1L I'M THINKING OF PUTTING A BOUNTY ON MURPHY'S HEAD!...WA3HAE Finally topped WA3HAE, but it was a little tainted; he blew the first IF in his TS850 two days before. It gave me a nice rate and made my very part-time effort fun...K1HT For those who wondered about the derivation of the name GAT, particularly Dale, KG5U, and including those who knowingly chuckled following the exchange, it was given to me shortly after I started work at Channel 50 in Detroit 30 years ago. I used my initials on discrepancy reports and tech reports, and it was Tom, W8KOX, reading these, who gave me the name. It stuck, at least for all the old timers in

Engineering. Not much of a score, less than half of my CW score, which was nothing to brag about either. TNX to all for the QSOs...K8GT My first ever NAQP single op effort (normally part N0NI (ex NC0P) crew. Though not a top 10 effort, this score breaks the lowa record for NAQP SSB. Fantastic conditions on 160 and 80 gave me my best hour...WA0ETC Took my first break in the contest after only 35 minutes -- had to go to the office. Originally planned to go before the start of the contest, but spent too much time trying to work VK0IR. Congrats to teammate K6LL for another impressive performance. It always seems like Dave must be operating in some other contest than the one I'm in!... WA7BNM As WE9V said - this is a great contest. I really enjoy doing the multiop category in this contest. In looking at the scores it seems that the boys at KS9K beat us on 160m - other than that the scores are pretty close. I think this contest will be really wild when 10m opens up and we get the big rates on 10/15/20 from the start...K5TR Most surprising QSO: WB0O. I asked Bill if he is snowed in, and he says "no, it is 30F here" which is probably 10-15F warmer than it is in NC. Amazing! Most enjoyable QSO: KE4RHU. Erin is a local budding contester. I believe she is 8 or 9 and General class. At her request, I move through the bands for her. She is silky smooth in her operating. By the way, she obviously has good genes. Her older sister is AD4PU who you know doubt have seen in several contest write-ups... K4MA Got started at 1830Z when the battery on the car went south and I was late arriving at K7UP's!! The shape of things to come!...W5FX @ K7UP Boy did 10/15 not play like they did in the CW last weekend! Of course, unless you were K6LL!!! 400 + on 15 WOW!!!!...K5NZ In a word, COLD! Fired up from the truck parked on my parents road - yeah, not EXACTLY mobile to the true definition, but close enough! Made first Q within minutes of 1800Z and spent the next 2.5 hours S&P'ing across 15 & 20. I can't run the engine while I operate because of some serious EMI from various electrical system in the Land Rover so it started to get too cold after about 3 hours to continue. Temperature at this point was -2F and falling. Q's equal 75!...W9RM/M Bands sounded lousy, and 40 went long earlier than for CW it seemed. Could have been my sub-par dipole farm, though! This calls for DX QSOs between 1840 and 1850. Domestic SSB is above 1850. The suggested frequency per the NAQP rules is 1865. Also, another thing is that operating on 1840 LSB occupies about 40 percent of the CW DX window from 1830 to 1840. If your VFO says 1840 on SSB, you are actually transmitting from about 1837 to 1840. The ON4UN low band book suggests 1842.5 should be the lowest SSB frequency used. I hope we can all work together to keep the frequencies coordinated on 160 and not need FCC regulations. This is the only band below 30 Mhz without CW segments. Just because there is a contest, it doesn't mean we throw out the band plan...N6TR It was great to sit back and let the YLs (my wife KE3XS & her twin sister (KE3XZ) try their hand at contesting, felt like a coach behind a bench at a hockey game! With the name exchange as Chris, none of the ops knew the difference between an OM or YL...KB3A The goddess of 15m propagation favored Yuma this weekend!...K6LL Though not

a top 10 score this breaks the old lowa record for NAQP SSB. Much to my surprise best hour was 0400-0500Z with most of that time spent on 160...WA0ETC Had fun in this one after my disaster in RTTY Roundup. I squeezed every last minute out of the 10 hours and worked everyone I could hear. I believe that is the best score I can achieve from this station for me with one radio, now if I can only find a better operator...N9ITX/7 All S&P (in between working VK0IR on Heard I.) Thanks to K4NO for moving me to 10. I did the same thing to W4WA. Didn't know the band was even open!...AD1C Well, all I can say is bummer. I had a real bad NAQP this year. My antenna wouldn't tune due to ice, so I had to drop it, and heat it up with a hair dryer. My lowband antenna fell down, for no apparent reason. I only operated 2 hours and then gave up...WA1CFS I had a great time. I climbed the tower 1 hour before contest in 10 degree weather to put up a wire for 80 meters. During the second hour of the contest, I got a call that the VK0 was on 20 phone. I moved up and got him on the second call BAREFOOT!...K8BK Forgot Rule #1 for contesting. Popped the xcvr fuse 45 minutes before the test started -- no spares. Thanks to the XYL for a run to Radio Shack...KA9EKJ NAQP is one of my favorite tests ... most everyone is very friendly and I really like the name exchange. Sure beats 59(9) and a QTH...KR4YL Took me a long time to find a spot on 80 to call CQ. Finally ended up around 3895 and had a blast. I know I will never rate with the big guns in these contests, but I participate and submit my scores to let others know a lot of fun can be had with a very simple set-up. And, is it my imagination, or are the ops in NAQPs a lot more courteous?...KK5GT Going to sound like a broken record, but "what a fun contest". Too bad for K9PG, I had (slightly) more QSO's than he did (again). Also, my best 60 minutes was a 133 (on 80M) and Paul's best was a 120 on 160M...WE9V @ KS9K Why did I take a break in the middle of a 15 meter opening to run to Federal Express. I need to get my priorities straight. Contesting or work?...W6KY One of my better, if not my best, results. Figuring out how to load the 80M dipole on 160 has helped. It's not much of a signal, but it helps. Thanks to everyone that "dug" me out down there...WA3SES Lowlight: TH6 getting hung up in a maple tree and not turning past 240 deg. Tempted to climb the tree with bow saw in hand but wind chill put temp well below zero. Highlight: Switching to 30 meters @ 0150z and working the VK0 Had a great time!...K1ZO What a great contest! Had a number of contacts that could really have been considered QSO's especially on 75. Excellent way to compare station performance with everyone running low power. Low bands very long, and nothing exciting about the high bands...K8MR All of the bands seemed to be very long from here -even 80 and 160. Heard only ONE New York and NO New Jersey!...K1SD Thanks to Don for letting me drive 'EEN solo. My first attempt from So. Cal and I clearly bolluxed the propagation patterns. Down on 15M Q's/Mults and I left 40M too early and it seemed longish by the time I returned. Great fun regardless of those errors. Kudos to NK7U and K5TR for trying on 160 (antenna down for construction project)...K17WX @ W6EEN.
