This was a very strong showing for the August NA QSO Party. Scores were way up over last August and also were higher than the January '96 numbers. We had good log submissions, many via the Internet, and we were able to snag a few last minute logs using Internet Nagging. There were several first-time NAQP and first-time-ever entries, and strong evidence that lots of new folks are getting introduced to contesting by operating at a multi-op station (see the KC4ZV and WA5DWX listings).

Don, N4ZZ, had a great contest, beating his nearest competitor by over 50k points and demolishing his Tennessee All-Time record from January '95. Don also earned the #9 berth in the All-Time Top 10 Single Op scorecard. Once again the TACO bunch (led by #2 single op NM5M) took the top team score.
