

Results: North American QSO Party SSB — August 2020

What a turnout for the August running of the North American QSO Party SSB edition. We received 1,177 submitted logs, nearly a 50% increase from last August's event and the largest number ever submitted to any NAQP SSB. Typically, the January event has about 40% more logs than August. Breaking that trend, the August running attracted 86 more logs than January. Despite the increase in submissions, no overall scoring records were set.

Soapbox comments did not indicate the increase was pandemic-related, although this may have been a factor for some. Others joined in for the fun and friendly nature of the contest. It is a great event to introduce others to contesting or even just to ham radio.

If you worked, one of the young ladies at WA5SOG, you helped Ed demonstrate this to his granddaughters — Burklee and Tatum — had a blast but not as much as he did sharing this special time with them (see photo).

Todd, KO3Z, in Pennsylvania has been having fun with his basic station in the 4 years he has been licensed. He even managed to work both New Zealand and Kuwait one night. Todd sent in his paper log of only 11 contacts for his limited time. He is an example of the fun people can have without an elaborate contest-grade station. Todd demonstrates you don't have to wait until you complete your upgrades to participate.

The last individual to highlight this time is Sam, WA9VBG, the trustee of W9IMH at the Indiana Masonic Home Amateur Radio Club. At 84, Sam had never taken part in a contest before. This was his first. His paper log recorded 84 contacts. Sam was concerned about making too many mistakes. While his error rate was on the high side for an average contester, it is respectable for a first-time participant.

Single Operator

Finishing first in the Single Operator category was Marty, NN1C, oper-

ating from W1KM. This is only his third entry in the SSB event. Marty recently graduated from high school and has an impressive resume that you can read on his web site **NN1C.org**.

In second was familiar Top 10 finisher Craig, K9CT. Of the past eight events, Craig has finished in the Top 10 six times. Third-place finisher Jeff, N8II, said he started the event with no intentions of putting in a serious effort. However, he benefitted from sporadic E on 10 meters along with good conditions on 15. Jeff said conditions seemed to favor his location this time around, and he wonders if he could have finished first had he tried harder.

QRP

Repeating in the top position in the QRP category is Randy, NDØC. His error rate again was just 0.7%. We all could take a lesson from him on how to decrease our error rates. In a solid second place was Jay, W8UA, using an OCF dipole in his attic. Finishing out the top three was John, N4TOL, who also used an OCF dipole, although his was outdoors.

Multi-Two

In a close Multi-Two race, N5YA finished in front of KA4RRU. N5YA finished with a score of 400,292 compared to KA4RRU's 397,936 points. Their tight battle continued into log checking with both stations having an error rate of 2.6%. Operators at N5YA included N5YA, N5NU, and K5QE. The team at KA4RRU included KA4RRU, WA4PGM, and WØCN. Finishing third was W2RE, scoring 283,235 points. Operators at W2RE included W4IPC, AA4LS, and KC1KUG.

Teams

In the team competition, SMC Integrated Circuits handily won over second-place MRRC/NCC Team.
