Results: North American Sprint, RTTY — March 2013

The 25th North American RTTY Sprint provided good conditions for the 188 participants recorded in the 97 logs we received. There were 51 multipliers in those logs — only the second time that number has been reached. Mike, K5NZ, and Ken, N6RO, captured the most multipliers with 43 each.




Figure 1 — RTTY Sprint participation over the years.

While activity was up compared to last October, greater participation will make the contest more fun and challenging for everyone (see Figure 1). March activity is nearly double that of October activity, and even the peaks of 200 participants are not enough. Probably 300 or more participants are needed to avoid the slower rates toward the end.

Once again Mark (aka "Mork"), K6UFO, took QRP honors with 6000 points, likely a record. He was 12th overall and 8th in total multipliers with 40.

Two of the Top 10 finishers were low power — Jay, W1UJ, and Rusty, W6OAT. Three of the Top 10 were SO1R — Ed, WØYK; Mark, K5AM, and Rusty, W6OAT. It is wonderful to see Rusty having so much fun in the RTTY Sprint after helping create the original NA Sprint, which was initially a CW-only event.

Dean, NØXR, and Bud, AA3B, were close for the two top spots, but Dean prevailed due to more mults, although Bud had nine more contacts. For third and fourth place, there was an even closer race between Ken, N6RO, and Dave, K6LL. These two are often found leapfrogging each other in CW, SSB and RTTY contests. This time Ken barely squeaked by Dave by only 15 points! As with the first two places, Ken came out on top due to two more mults than Dave, who had nine more contacts.

Golden logs are rare in any contest and more so in the Sprint. Nonetheless, George, K3GP, and Ray, ND8L, managed error-free logs with more than 100 contacts. Scott, K7ZO, was close behind at 98 contacts. In all, there were 12 golden logs.

The team competition was the closest in memory, with essentially a single contact separating the top two teams, NCCC #1 and SWACC. Three of the top four finishers were on SWACC, but NCCC #1's members scored a marginally higher average score across their 10 teammates. Thanks to all seven registered teams.

where you can improve accuracy and operating skill. Call sign sign and exchange errors simply lose credit for the contact, but not appearing in the log of the other station (NIL) costs contact credit plus one additional contact. If the lost QSO was a mult, that further reduces your score. On the other hand, slowing down too much to avoid mistakes also may reduce your score. LCRs are available by request to ed@w0yk.com.
