

# Results: North American Sprint RTTY — October 2011

The 22<sup>nd</sup> North American RTTY Sprint attracted 129 active stations, according to the 51 logs submitted. There were 41 multipliers in the logs. A number of the Sprint regulars were missing this time, due to critical priorities that fell on top of the event. There was a lot of activity from Cuba this time, with five different call signs worked: CO2VE, CO2IZ, CO2MS, CO2CW and CO2RR. XE1XOE was the other non-US/VE station.

Mark, K6UFO, topped the QRP division with 91 contacts and 3003 points. Low Power regular Ron, N0AT, led the 32 entrants and placed second overall. Participants turned in a lot of Golden Logs. Mike, N7MH, operating from W6YX, led with his 102-contact log.

Six of the Top 10 operators were running SO2R, which may have been less of an advantage, given the modest activity level this time. Once again many Top 10 finishers were in the West. Low Power and QRP stations also did very well compared to the High Power entries.

In the club competition the South West Arizona Contest Club (SWACC) assembled a partial team from around the country to best the partial team from the Northern California Contest Club (NCCC).

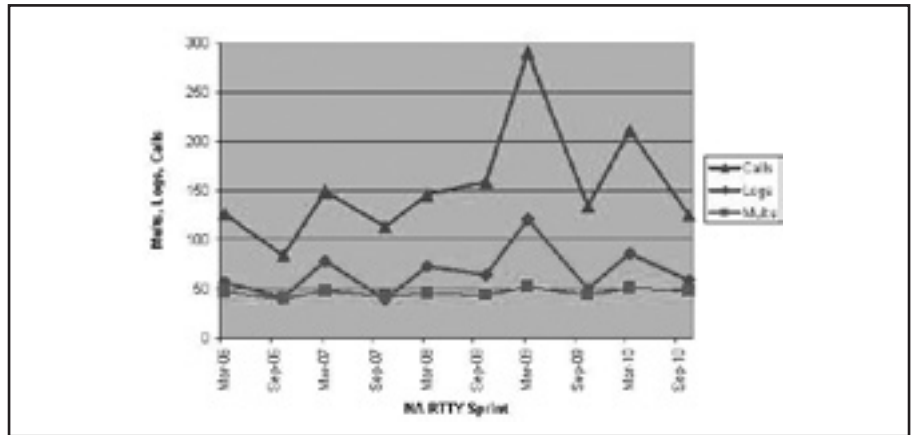


Figure 1 — RTTY Sprint participation over the last 5 years

## Operating

Several logs contained a number of busted exchanges that propagated to a second and third band. While the Sprint places emphasis on speed, operators must balance that with accuracy. Sprint log checking is *very* strict, with most logging errors captured. Because of this, the Sprint format is a great way to build operating skill; it's unfortunate that more operators don't take advantage of these twice-yearly

RTTY, CW and SSB events. Of course, another feature of the Sprints is their short duration, which means participants do not have to devote an entire weekend to ham radio contesting.

With the March RTTY Sprint just ahead, think about what you can do to increase participation, such as forming a team, either within your local club or of stations from around the region. The RTTY Sprint will be a lot more fun with greater participation.
