# Results: North American Sprint RTTY — October 2012

The 24th North American Sprint RTTY provided good conditions, but with activity from just 114 participants across the 54 logs submitted. As WI9WI observed, "Way too much dead air and too many unanswered CQs."

There were 41 active multipliers and N6RO — an RTTY newbie(!) — snagged 37 of them for top honors in that dimension. Ken also had the greatest number of band changes, as he scoured the ether for additional contacts.




Figure1 — RTTY Sprint activity over the years

Where was everyone? Well, this editor had repairs to perform on the 20, 40 and 80 meter antennas, so that's my excuse. But seriously! This contest is a lot of fun, and more participation would add to the merriment. Consider joining the party and invite your friends to do the same. The October running is always the biggest challenge in terms of generating activity (see Figure 1).

## **Results Overview**

"Mork," signing K6UFO and identifying as "Mark" in terrestrial life, was the only brave QRP entrant and took 12th place overall among the low and high power folks. NØAT took Low Power bragging rights and third place overall. K6LL and N6RO duked it out in the High Power category, as they often do in CW events. Although Dave had two fewer mults, he prevailed, with only two lost QSOs compared to Ken's seven. These contests are always a balance between rate and accuracy — the cornerstone of effective communication.

Four of the Top 10 were SO1R, showing that number of radios juggled and power level were not significant factors this time. Given that this is a relatively low-rate contest, the Golden Log ranking was not as easy to attain as you mighthave expected. Only seven stations made the list. KØYQ and WI9WI topped that category, perfectly logging 74 and 67 contacts, respectively.

#### **Team Competition**

The South West Arizona Contest Club (SWACC) assembled a partial team of seven entries from around the country to best the three-entrant team from the Northern California Contest Club (NCCC). Imagine how things might have turned out, if full teams of 10 participants had been formed? (This is a not-so-subtle hint

Very few dupes appeared in logs this time, so perhaps we've shed the remnants of the old "legal dupe" rule for RTTY, abandoned several years ago. Sprint log checking is very strict; each character in the call sign and exchange must be perfect. NILs (not in log) are penalized with an additional contact removed. In the Sprint the opportunity, of course, is to improve one's speed and accuracy in

communicating, and the log checking is aimed at helping participants determine how well they are doing. Be sure to request your LCR (log check report) for a detailed analysis of how well you did (ed@w0yk.com)
