

February 2009 Results: North American RTTY QSO Party

Oh, the value of multipliers! The "Ruff"ians at K9SEX collected 82 more contacts than the perennial winners at W6YX, but the W6YX crew picked up 22 more multipliers and thereby another in a long string of wins in the multi-two category. K15XP continued his domination in single operator category. SWACC #1 led the ever-growing team competition. WW4LL (Georgia), W0YK (California), KL7RA (Alaska), VE4EAR (Manitoba) and VA2UP (Quebec) established new state/provincial records. Log submissions totaled 415, and 25 of those came from DX stations. It's certainly encouraging to see so many "my first RTTY contest" comments in the soapbox.

Let me emphasize again that during the NAQP RTTY, transmitting is discouraged between 14.099 and 14.101 to avoid QRMing the NCDXF beacons. In addition — in the spirit of cooperation — please refrain from transmitting between 14.069 and 14.073, as this interferes with PSK31 operation.

Many thanks to Bruce, WA7BNM, for handling the log checking, to Icom America for sponsoring the plaque program and most of all to the participants. NAQP RTTY is all about the participants, not just the winners, and I encourage all participants to recruit others to join the fun in the future.
