

Results: North American Sprint, CW, February 2026

A nice crowd showed up for the 97th running of the CW North American Sprint, with 187 Sprint logs submitted and a total of 224 unique call signs. This was up about 12% from the February 2025 Sprint and a whopping 35% increase over the September 2025 running. The gain in fun showed up in the scores — a minimum of 317 QSOs was needed to make the High-Power Top 15, compared to only three ops breaking 300 contacts in September.

Some database research by Trey, N5KO, showed that most of the increase in participation came from call signs that have not shown up in the last 12 CW Sprints, dating back to February 2020. Welcome — or welcome back — to all, but kudos to the top eight fresh fists who were on all three bands (John, W4IX; Steve, K5MR; Robert, N3FR; John, N8PE; Mark, K6UFO; Connor, W4IPC; Max, N4ML, and E.F., W9YK) and the four who activated rare multipliers: AD7N (Utah); N4ML (Maine);

VE5CPU (Saskatchewan), and W4IX (South Carolina). Only one lucky op worked VE5CPU! Thanks to Trey and Phil, K3UA, for the pre-Sprint outreach.

Records

Three records were set this time around (from K5PI):

- K8MR broke his own Florida Low Power record from last year.
- New Ohioan K5ZD broke K8MR's 2003 High Power record.
- NØAX broke his own Missouri Low Power record from 10 years ago.

Golden Logs

Four operators turned in error-free, triple-digit logs: W4EF (297 QSOs), AG9A (126), N5OT (124), and K9NW (104). Four other ops had smaller, but still flawless, logs: N6AN, AC5TU, W6FB, and VE5CPU, the latter of whom joined Heather, AH7RF, in the “Make One QSO Very, Very Carefully” club.

Strategy

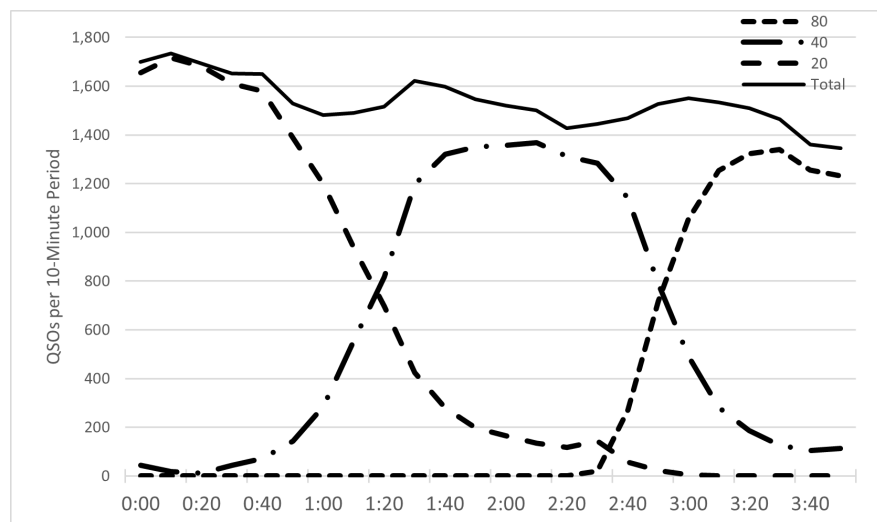


Figure 1 — QSOs by band per hour.

Conditions were pretty good for this declining solar cycle, with 20 meters open for the first three hours for most ops. For those with just one transceiver, a common default strategy is to spend 90 minutes on 20 meters, 90 minutes on 40, and 60 minutes on 80, when the crowd is large enough. Figure 1 shows that strategy was widely in play this time around, and the QSO split (20 meters 38%, 40 meters 39%, and 80 meters 23%) showed the time investment was matched by rate payoff.

The single-band winners were:

- 20 meters: N6MJ and KM7W, each with 143 contacts
- 40 meters: N2NT with 112
- 80 meters: K3LR with 112 (Tim gets an honorary “Even Steven” award for 111 QSOs on 20 and 40 meters to go along with 112 on 80.)

N5TJ topped the charts with 53 multipliers. Adding all those numbers up results in a theoretical Multi-Three Sprint score of 366 contacts times 53 multipliers for 19,398 total points, a phenomenal score but still below W4AN's (SK) record of 21,816, set in September 2003. The all-time “Franken-score” takes N6TR's 426 QSOs (February 2005) and the N5KO (September 22) and K4RO (February 2024) joint record of 56 mults to reach 23,856 points.

The Finish Line

Top Overall Scores

At the top of the heap, Tree, N6TR, and Chris, KM7W, both cleared 18,000 points. Chris had a slow first hour, but Tree gave back his initial 13-contact lead with a slow (by top op standards) second

hour. Chris finished strong, but Tree's 52 multipliers were enough to overcome a 17-contact deficit and earn his 15th win — tying N5TJ for most wins of all time — and his 72nd time in the top ten. Trey, N5KO, came in just 245 points behind Chris, with a slow third hour leaving him in third place. Trey did win the “Twitchy Finger” award for topping the crowd with 148 band changes.

The remaining seven scores in the top ten were separated by less than 600 points. Bob, N6TV, took fourth place, putting minimal QSYer Dan, N6MJ, in fifth. Andy, N2NT, in sixth, was the top East Coast score, followed by Steve, N2IC, in seventh place. Dave, K5GN, took eighth place despite almost forgetting to use his bandswitch knob at all. Kirk, K4RO, and Randy, K5ZD, tied for 9th place with identical 345 QSO × 50 multiplier efforts. That allowed Pat's, N9RV, 362 QSO effort to achieve tenth place despite only finding 47 multipliers.

High Power Classic — Max 12 Band Changes

Dan, N6MJ, and Dave, K5GN, each working with only two band changes, came in first and second, respectively, in the Classic category. Gator, N5RZ, was 1 QSO and 1 multiplier behind Dave to take third place. Jeff, N5TJ, and Mike, W9RE, were the top band changers among the Classic crew with 4 and 3, respectively, to take fourth and fifth place. Finishing sixth, Tim, K3LR, led a parade of “Coasters” (North for Tim, East for the others) as John, W2GD; Doug, K1DG, and Bill, W2RQ, filled the seventh, eighth, and ninth spots. Bob, K6XX, closed out the Classic top ten, joining

N6MJ as the only two West Coast-ers.

Low Power

In a strong showing, Randy, KØEU, broke the 300-QSO, 50-multiplier mark to take first, 10 contacts and 3 multipliers ahead of September's winner, Lar, K7SV. Ray, WQ5L, made more than 2.7 contacts per watt to claim the third spot in the Low Power category by a mere 21 points, using an advantage of 1 multiplier and 2 fewer lost QSOs to overcome a 5-contact lead by fourth-place finisher John, W4IX (one of our “Fresh Fist” honorees). Jim, K8MR, passed the 13,000-point mark to come in fifth.

Sixth- through ninth-place scores were separated by less than 800 points. Ward, NØAX, found the right mix of QSOs and multipliers to finish sixth, besting Bud, N7CW, by one of each. Joe, N8EA, and Fred, KG9X, took orthogonal approaches, with Joe's more QSOs, fewer multipliers topping Fred's fewer QSOs, lots of multipliers strategy to take seventh. Jim, W8WTS, claimed the final spot in the top ten.

Most of the top ten shunned their bandswitch knobs enough to claim spots in the Classic Low Power top ten, with Lar, K7SV, coming in first, and Ray, WQ5L; John, W4IX; Jim, K8MR; Ward, NØAX; Craig, N7XQ; Joe, N8EA, and Fred, KG9X, filling out second through eighth. Jim, K6ZH (the only 6-lander in the Low Power top fifteen), used a two-multiplier advantage over Ron, NØAT, to take ninth place.

QRP

Dan, K7SS, now has a QRP three-peat, topping the peanut-whistle pile in QSOs (205) and multipliers (47). Returning Sprinter

Mark, K6UFO, came in second, followed by Al, W1FJ, in third. Gary, K9AY; Bill, NØAC; Ron, WQ6X; Matt, KC1UBH, and Dave, N6AN, filled out the rest of the QRP adventurers.

Team Competition

Two coastal behemoths battled it out in a close race in Team competition, with Northern California Contest Club #1 beating FRC 1 by a mere 1,000 points. The Zoomers repeated their third-place finish from September, followed by five OH and PA guys calling themselves “OH and PA Guys,” who managed to double the score of the “PA & OH & IN Guys” team.

Twenty-three teams sent in scores this time. Getting a team together is a great way to increase overall participation and fun!

Next Time

The next CW Sprint will take place on September 13 UTC (Saturday, September 12, in US time zones). The event starts at 0000 UTC, and stations may operate from 0000 to 0359 UTC inclusive. If you start a QSO just before the clock ticks over to 0400, you may finish it and log it at 0359. For team registration, use the *NCJ* web page, **www.ncjweb.com**. Submit logs via the log submission form on the *NCJ* website. Logs are due 7 days after the contest! Final scores are typically posted on the *NCJ* website within 2 weeks of the contest.
