FIRST NCJ NORTH AMERICAN SPRINT CONTEST

<u>Question</u>: Where can you find a contest created expressly by, and for the radiosportsman, designed to make everyone involved in it remain open and receptive to new techniques and strategies, right down to the moment it begins...one requiring cooperation and respectable behavior to make it go, and gets results to <u>you</u>, the participant, one month later, instead of the usual six or seven?

Answer: the NATIONAL CONTEST JOURNAL, of course.

Here it is, the finished product you've been waiting for. Never has there been a competition quite like the NA Sprint, as anyone who participated can testify. During the short four-hour period the bands went wilder than they'd been all summer long. After a quick scan of a few of the logs, it can be seen that over 150 different calls were involved in this contest. Of the 90 stations who turned in their logs, only 16 stations logged less that 75 QSOs. A whopping 10 stations worked more than 200!! Indeed, the Sprint is here to stay.

TEAM COMPETITION

One feature of this test which attracted tremendous attention was the team competition. The winning effort came from a group who labeled themselves as "Independent Contesters", a plan masterminded by John, W2GD, to assemble a crew of stations and operators which meant business. It was by far the most well organized group that entered (look at the statistics!), and clearly demonstrates the payoff attained by doing something right the first time. The Mad River Club was a good solid second but possesed only two-thirds the score of the Independents. Next were the SCCC and NCCC battling it out for third place, followed by the Texas DX Society and the YCCC. Fighting for fifth place, the bottom entry is certainly worth hohorable mention. The Kansas City Key Club entered the war with only two entries...man, every little bit counts! Keep it up, you guys, next year there's bound to be competition on your level...after all, it's all relative, and depends only on your own goals.

27 different operators/calls will receive an award...many with multiple endorsements. Award criteria was based on recognition as viewed by the Sprint contest committee and NCJ Editor, NGCJ. Consideration was made toward state-level breakdown, but not enough activity was seen. A better breakdown was most obvious as a result of the scores: by call area...the lowest score being just above 6000 points. In summary, awards were distributed as follows: Top team score...perpetual trophy, awarded to team captain. Top single operator score...trophy, to be kept by the winner. Top ten single operator score...certificate. District leaders...certificate. #1 in team...certificate. Each member participating in the Sprint on the #1 team...certificate. Each participant in the Sprint will receive this Summary issue. CU in the next Sprint!
