

# Results, 2004 RTTY Sprints

2004 proved to be an interesting year for the RTTY Sprints. The March Sprint saw an increase in the number of logs received (69), whereas there was a decline in the number of logs received (44) for the October Sprint. However, the larger number of logs submitted for the March Sprint also produced an increase in the number of problem logs.

Among the problem logs, there were several that contained multiple violations of the QSY rule. In fact, there were several instances of 5 or 6 QSOs having been made on the same frequency. It was also reported to this author that there were violations of the rule prohibiting more than one transmitted signal at one time. Having no independent verification of this, this author can only recommend that each of us take a moment to read the rules (again).

The most troubling issue, at least to this author, came to light through the comments of one of the March participants. Paraphrasing, the comment was to the effect that because of what was perceived as poor operating practices and sportsmanship; this was the first and last RTTY Sprint for this operator. All this author can say is that I hope he will reconsider. Enough said for now about the rules and on to the results.
